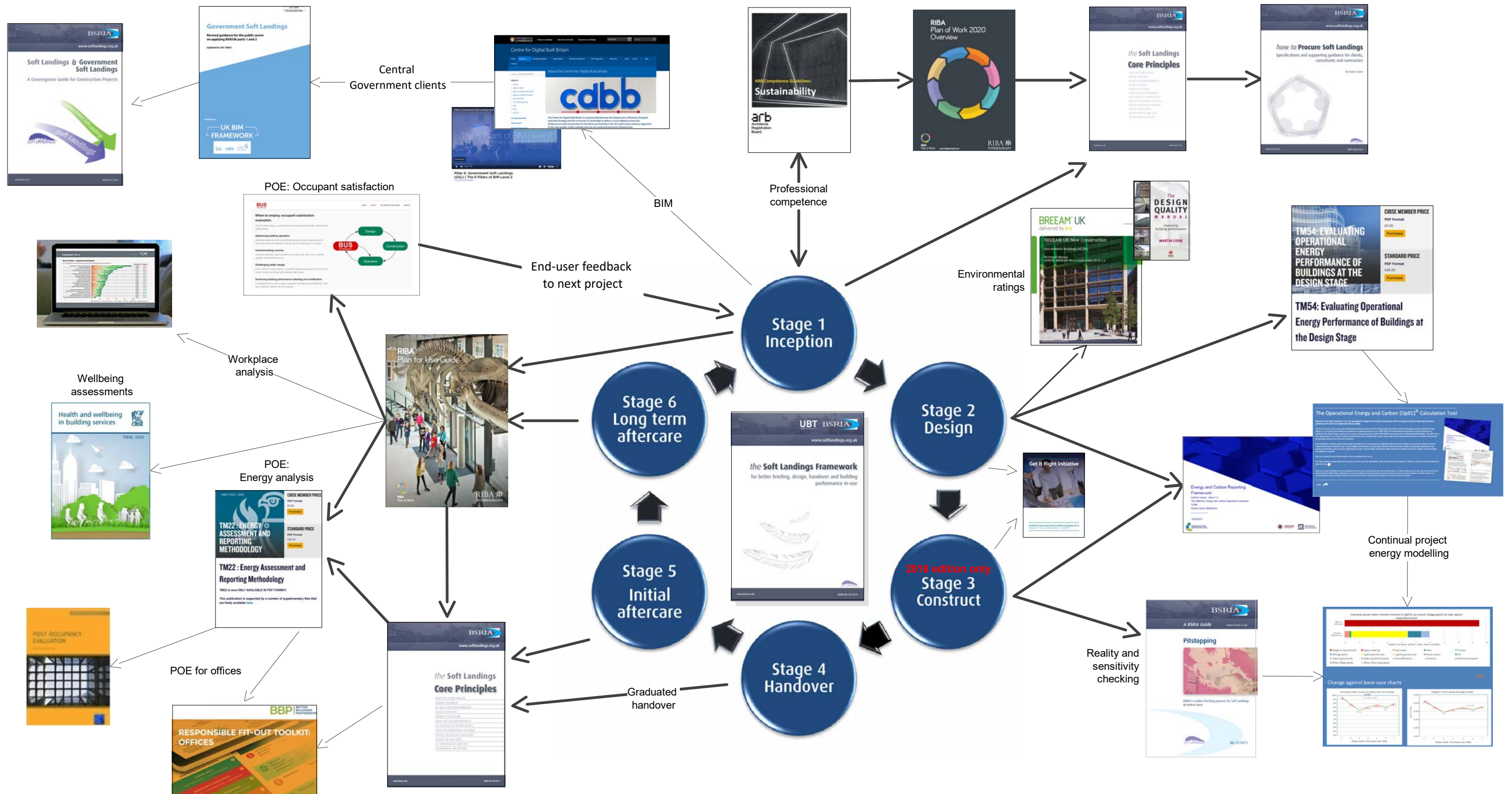




# The SOFT LANDINGS GUIDANCE MAP
